GREEN TEAM – WEEKLY ARTICLE

From WTTW...the Field Museum's largest exhibit isn't its grand dinosaur hall...It's the Rice Native Garden: 100,000 square feet of plantings that wrap around the museum's exterior. Installed in 2016-17, the garden replaced swaths of lawn and impermeable pavement with a more sustainable living exhibit...And the Field gives away pieces of this display to the public, for free...Every fall, Field staff brings groups of volunteers into the Rice garden to harvest ripened seed, collecting roughly one-third to donate and leaving the remainder for wildlife and for the plants to reproduce.
